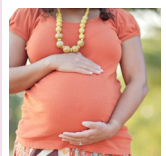
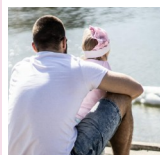
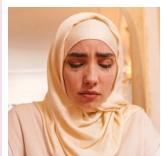
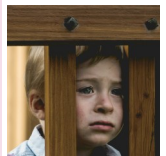
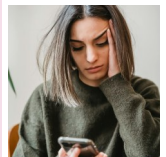
Domestic can happen to anyone — regardless of age, background, ethnicity, gender identity, sex, religion or sexual orientation. The police receive a domestic abuse-related call every 30 seconds.

1 in 4 women in England and Wales will experience domestic abuse in their lifetime. The harmful impacts of domestic abuse on survivors can affect their mental health, physical wellbeing and family safety

Approximately **1 in 7 children** in the UK have been exposed to domestic abuse. It is vital to recognise that these children do not simply ‘witness’ domestic abuse; they are recognised in law as victims in their own right. Domestic abuse can profoundly affect a child's development, behaviour, health, education, and overall wellbeing, with impacts that can last into adulthood.
